

To be eligible for licensure as a specialist in one of the nine dental specialties recognized by the Canadian Dental Association in the province of Prince Edward Island the Dental Council requires:

For licensure for a dental specialist not licensed in another Canadian jurisdiction before July 1, 2001:

1. A copy of the degree or certificate issued by the general dental program from which you graduated.
2. A copy of your National Dental Examining Board [NDEB] Certificate, if applicable.
3. A copy of your diploma/certificate from an accredited dental specialty program recognized by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada.
4. A copy of your NDEB certificate, when applicable.
5. Successful completion of the National Dental Specialty Examination [NDSE] administered by the RCDC.
6. A copy of your current license to practice, if applicable.
7. A letter of good standing from all previous jurisdictions where licensure was held.
8. Completion of the application for membership in the Dental Association of PEI.
9. Payment of registration and licensing fees.
10. Proof of malpractice insurance.

Dental Specialists, who have been licensed in a Canadian Jurisdiction before July 1, 2001 will be considered for specialty licensure on PEI under the terms of the Mutual Recognition Agreement for the Profession of Dentistry in Canada with Respect to Dental Specialties, dated August 30, 2001.
