

To be eligible to practice general dentistry in the province of Prince Edward Island the Dental Council requires:

For licensure for a general dentist not licensed in another Canadian jurisdiction before July 1, 2001:

1. A copy of your degree or certificate from an accredited dental school recognized by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada.
2. A copy of your National Dental Examining Board certificate.
3. A copy of your current license to practice; if applicable.
4. A letter of goodstanding from all previous jurisdictions where licensure was held.
5. Present written evidence from two sources of his/her aptitude, character, and capability to become a competent and ethical member of the Association.
6. Completion of the application for membership in the Dental Association of PEI.
7. Payment of the registration and licensing fees.
8. Proof of malpractice insurance.

General Dentists who have been licensed in a Canadian jurisdiction before July 1, 2001 will be considered for licensure on PEI under the terms of the Mutual Recognition Agreement for the Profession of Dentistry in Canada with Respect to General Dentistry, dated August 30, 2001.
